

A MAJOR MILESTONE FOR AUSSIE ARK!

This month we announced an incredible milestone; our 500th Tasmanian devil joey has been born at Aussie Ark! Meet Milo, the milestone devil, a wild-born male joey who made his grand entrance into the world in the Barrington Wildlife Sanctuary. This is a moment of immense significance not only for Aussie Ark as an organisation but for the entire species, which is still facing extinction in the wild.

The Tasmanian devil has always been the symbolic and signature species of Aussie Ark. Our organisation was founded with the primary mission of saving this iconic species from the brink of extinction when the devastating Devil Facial Tumour Disease threatened their survival in the mid-1990s.

This incredible journey started in 2011 when our Barrington Tops facility welcomed its first cohort of 44 disease-free Devils from Tasmania, marking the beginning of our ambitious breeding and rewilding program. A pivotal moment arrived when 11 Devils were released into the Barrington Wildlife Sanctuary in 2020, the first time these majestic creatures set foot on mainland Australia in over 3000 years. Since then, these amazing animals have thrived, and today, we proudly care for the largest insurance population of Tasmanian Devils in the world.

Each and every Tasmanian Devil joey born is a testament to the success of our program and the hope it brings for the future of Australia's ecology. These apex predators play a crucial role in maintaining

balance and harmony within their ecosystem, benefiting the entire environment. Milo, our 500th joey, symbolises this hope for a brighter future for our unique biodiversity.

We are excited to share with you that in late May, we officially opened our state-of-the-art Brush-tailed Rock-wallaby enclosures at Aussie Ark's Barrington Tops facility. We welcomed sponsors, partners, media representatives, and dignitaries to the heart of Aussie Ark. Our vision, which you have helped shape, came to life as six meticulously crafted enclosures were unveiled, marking a pivotal moment in our ongoing journey.

For over four years, our breeding program has been a beacon of hope, a labour of love, and a commitment to preserving the fragile balance of our ecosystem. These six new enclosures are a testament to our dedication and passion that drives us forward.

Each enclosure has been thoughtfully designed to accommodate a breeding pair of the endangered Brush-tailed Rock-wallabies. The birth of each joey within these enclosures becomes a cherished addition to our 'insurance population,' safeguarding this remarkable species for generations to come.

We were honoured by the presence of esteemed individuals, including Dr. Kerry Cameron from the federal government's Office of Threatened Species Commissioner, who beautifully articulated the urgency of our mission. "Aussie Ark's work is critically important," she affirmed.

The ceremony was adorned with heart-warming

moments, as a Director on Aussie Ark's Board, Brad Walker, stood before us, sharing his deep connection with our cause. His words echoed with passion: "How could you not love this facility? How could you not love the meaning and the importance of such a facility for the conservation of animals?" Brad's sentiment resonated deeply, reminding us that champions for animals are the cornerstone of our success.

A highlight of the day was the introduction of a Brush-tailed Rock-wallaby male from Featherdale Wildlife Park – a symbol of rejuvenation and diversity within our breeding program. This male carries the legacy of prime breeding age, infusing our genetic pool. Alongside him, two females, nurtured and born within our embrace, embarked on a new chapter within the enclosures, ready to continue the circle of life.

Managing Director, Tim Faulkner, says "Brush-tailed Rock-wallabies are one of Aussie Ark's signature species, and the enclosures being opened today are best considered a 'halfway house'. This is where wallabies live and breed, so that we have extra wallabies to return to our sanctuaries and the wild."

HEAD OVER HEELS IN LOVE!

We have an incredibly heartwarming story to share with you, and one that highlights the critical role you play in our conservation efforts. Dandarah, Aussie Ark's ambassador Long-nosed potoroo, is starting her journey into motherhood! For three years, she has captured the hearts of our staff and visitors alike with her interactive and endearing nature.

Now, we are thrilled to announce that Dandarah has found love in the arms of Fredrick, a handsome male potoroo born and bred right here at Aussie Ark. This is a momentous occasion as it marks Dandarah's first opportunity to contribute to the survival of her species.

Aussie Ark Wildlife Ranger, Matt Helm, orchestrated the delicate introduction. With utmost care, he conducted health checks for both potoroos. Then, he placed Fredrick's pet-pack inside Dandarah's enclosure and opened the door, allowing Dandarah to venture towards her potential mate. At first, it wasn't quite love at first sight as she found a piece of banana that she much preferred. However, true love couldn't be denied for long. Soon enough, Fredrick emerged from his hiding place, and the pair found themselves needing a bit of privacy.

"We're giving them a few days to get acquainted with each other, while discreetly monitoring their secret love-life through camera traps,"

- Mr. Helm.

These camera traps have captured some exquisite moments between Dandarah and Fredrick, including mating behaviours that fill our hearts with hope for the future. As marsupials, Long-nosed potoroos have a remarkably short gestation period of just 40 days. In a couple of months, we will conduct a pouch check, eagerly anticipating the discovery of Dandarah's first joey, a moment that will mark a significant milestone in the preservation of her species.

Long-nosed potoroos are nocturnal creatures, often unknown to many Australians. Yet, they play a vital role as "ecosystem engineers" in Australian ecology. Sadly, they face significant threats from feral predation and habitat loss, pushing them towards extinction. That's why Aussie Ark's breeding program holds tremendous importance for their long-term survival. We are thrilled that Dandarah now has the chance to contribute to the conservation of her species.

Rocket, Aussie Arks Brush-tailed Rock-wallaby joey, has Continued to thrive under the care of our head of operations Dean Reid.. Now a robust nine and a half months old, Rocket has more than tripled his weight from 600 grams to 2 kilograms, a testament to the nurturing care he's received since his rescue. In nature, this stage marks the transition from pouch-bound life to a world of exploration, a transition mirrored by Aussie Ark's Operations Manager, Dean Reid, who has become Rocket's surrogate 'Dad'.

Dean's commitment to Rocket's growth is unwavering, mirroring the natural weaning process. Within the walls of Dean's home, Rocket hones his jumping skills, preparing for the rocky landscapes that define his species' natural habitat. Being a nocturnal species, Rocket really comes alive at night!

Rocket turned Dean's home into his own rocky landscape using Dean's furniture as launching pads, with Dean even finding him on top of his washing machine and testing his legs zooming around the house. Rocket looked ready for his next step!

Rocket is now ready to be transitioned to one of Aussie Arks 12 purpose built Brush Tailed Rock Wallaby enclosures - complete with 5m high giant boulder mounds, heated tunnels and predator proof fencing. His natural instincts and agility will continue to develop as we monitor his progress and expose him to the other Brush Tailed Rock Wallabies in our breeding program. We will continue to keep you updated on his story.

Not only does Rocket stand as an emblem of hope but as a testament to our collective commitment to Brush Tailed Rock Wallaby conservation. Dean passionately shares,

"Rocket's species is endangered... So, saving little Rocket, to go back into our breeding program, has been a highlight of my life."

Rocket's journey continues, as he grows to become a beacon of hope for his species, one destined to father future generations of Brush-tailed Rock wallabies.

MANNING RIVER TURTLES FIND ROMANCE!

On World Turtle Day, Aussie Ark alongside our sister organisation the Australian Reptile Park, announced the first ever mating within our population of critically endangered Manning River turtles!

Ten sexually mature adult turtles are housed at our 'Conservation Ark' facility located at the Australian Reptile Park. This cohort is nationally significant, as a precious insurance population safeguarding the species from extinction. We first started the program five years ago, after conducting triage operations to collect wild eggs and turtles to save them from drought and fire, mostly notably during the Black Summer fires of 2019.

As its name suggests, the species is only found in the Manning River and its tributaries. The species has suffered steep decline and faces extinction without intervention, mostly due to fox predation and the damage of their shoreline nests by cattle.

Australian Reptile Park Operations Manager Billy Collett managed the breeding program, pairing

genetically suited females with males in large tanks. Over the course of a month he was thrilled to witness, and document, the courtship and breeding of multiple pairs.

"This is a massive historical moment for Aussie Ark!" - Mr Collett said.

"This is the first time we've seen breeding behaviour with our Manning River turtles. It is SO exciting! And I just can't wait to see those eggs!" Mr Collett said.

Last October - in a world first - Aussie Ark released 10 captive bred turtles back into the Manning River. Mr Collett said this year's successful breeding is another huge step for the program; it's hoped even more turtles can one day be returned to their homeland.

FUNGUS-FREE FROGS!

The Aussie Ark team, in partnership with the Australian Reptile Park have conducted routine swabbing of Conservation Ark's frog population and are delighted to confirm the deadly Chytrid Fungus is not present.

Conservation Ark, located at the Australian Reptile Park specialises in the breeding and rewilding of Aussie Ark's amphibian and reptile species, which includes critically important 'insurance populations' of the endangered Giant Barred frog and Stuttering frog. Our unwavering commitment to conservation is a beacon of hope for the endangered species.

Every six months these precious animals are swabbed for Chytrid Fungus. This highly contagious and deadly fungus affects the keratin in the skin - which impacts the way frogs breathe - and also disables the frogs' nervous system and normal movements. If untreated, it is fatal. The fungus has had a disastrous effect worldwide, wiping out one third of amphibian species globally and causing seven extinctions in Australia alone including the iconic Gastric Brooding frog.

So the stakes couldn't be higher for the frogs at Conservation Ark. Reptile Keeper Sam Herrmann conducted the swabbing efforts, which included every juvenile and adult frog in the facility.

"The reason why we test for Chytrid Fungus all the time is because our adult frogs - our established population - were wild-caught frogs," Mr Herrmann explained. "When they came in they did have Chytrid, which was treated, and now they're all Chytrid-free. So all we do is swab them so we know no Chytrid has entered our facility once again." Mr Herrmann said.

The swab is done on the frog's underside, from knees to armpits, on hands and feet. Each sample is placed in a labelled vile and sent to a university in Sydney for testing.

Aussie Ark and the Australian Reptile Park are delighted to confirm all frogs in the Conservation Ark facility tested negative for the fungus.

"Our frogs testing negative again affirms how critically important they are as insurance populations for Giant Barred and Stuttering frog species here at Conservation Ark - and for frogs in the wild - into the future,"

- Mr Herrmann concluded.

The future of conservation is alive and thriving as we uncover the discovery of 35 new Eastern quoll joeys nestled safely in their mothers' pouches. But that's not all – the next generation of young Aussie conservationists have jumped right into action alongside us!

Aussie Ark Managers, Liz Gabriel and Hayley Shute, recently embarked on the annual pouch checks, and this year, they were joined by their own kids – the true heartbeat of Aussie Ark's future. Young nature enthusiasts Jackson and Lily Gabriel, along with Beau, Isla, and Indy Shute, fearlessly embraced the challenge with passion and enthusiasm.

The kids aged 8 to 14, rolled up their sleeves, slipped on medical gloves, and were wide-eyed with wonder as pouch after pouch unveiled precious Eastern quoll joeys ranging from the size of tic-tacs to plump grapes. This unique experience unfolded within the walls of our Species Recovery Unit, where pairs of Eastern quolls are cared for in purpose built breeding enclosures.

Liz Gabriel, our Managing Director, highlights how being there with the kids added a touch of magic. "It's a reminder of the significance of keeping our kids connected to the wonders of nature," said Ms. Gabriel.

A sentiment echoed by 12-year-old Isla Shute, who couldn't contain her excitement. "It's absolutely inspiring! More kids should have the chance to witness

moments like these because they make life so much brighter," she said.

14-year-old Jackson Gabriel was equally captivated. "Being up close with an animal that's teetering on the edge of extinction is simply incredible. It's a unique experience that not every Aussie kid gets to have."

Extinct on the mainland since the 1960s due to feral predation, this resilient species clings to existence only in Tasmania. Yet, their numbers continue to dwindle. Aussie Ark is the proud home to the world's largest 'insurance population' of Eastern quolls, ensuring their survival for generations to come.

Hayley Shute, our Conservation Manager, couldn't be happier with the outcome. ***"We're sowing the seeds for the next generation to rise up, make a difference, and safeguard Australia's precious wildlife."*** Ms Shute said.

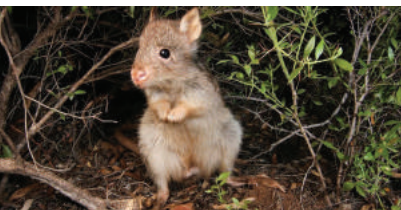
