Rocket, our Brush-tailed Rock-wallaby, has embarked on a new phase in his life, transitioning to his state-of-the-art enclosure in the Barrington Tops. The historic transfer of Parma Wallabies from the Australian Reptile Park to the Barrington Tops, along with the discovery of a precious joey, signifies a crucial step in our collective conservation efforts.

The release of 20 Rufous Bettongs and 20 Long-nosed Potoroos into the Barrington Wildlife Sanctuary marks a remarkable achievement in our ongoing efforts to safeguard this unique Australian species from extinction.

Finally, the introduction of the Eastern Quoll joeys, Jessie and James, adds a heartwarming chapter to our mission to preserve this endangered species. Their story reflects our unwavering commitment to conserving Australia's unique wildlife.

5 YEARS OF EASTERN QUOLLS!

We are thrilled to commemorate the 5-year milestone of working with Eastern Quolls, thanks to our partnership with Australian Geographic! This has fuelled the incredible success of Aussie Ark's Eastern quoll recovery program.

It all began with a visionary \$50,000 contribution that kick-started the initiative, and we are proud to share that this collaboration has led to the establishment of the world's largest insurance population of this precious species.

Thanks to your unwavering support and generosity, we have achieved remarkable milestones. Over the past five years, we have bred over 300 quolls, and today, there are eight thriving breeding pairs in our Species Recovery Unit, accompanied by a stable 'wild' population of approximately 120 adults within the Barrington Wildlife Sanctuary. Notably, last season alone witnessed an astounding 63 joeys born in the wild, a testament to our shared commitment to protecting and preserving these endangered species. Our Managing Director, Tim Faulkner, humbly acknowledges the pivotal role played by Australian Geographic, stating,

MEET SAM AND MESSI - THE DEVILISH JOEYS!

Meet the dynamic brother-sister duo, Sam and Messi, two Tasmanian Devil joeys! These rising stars are now under the loving care of Aussie Ark's very own Managing Director, Tim Faulkner, and his family.

Mr Faulkner, a passionate advocate for Australian wildlife conservation, has taken the initiative to introduce his sons, Billy and Matty, to the art of caring for these iconic Tasmanian Devils. Through their dedication, Sam and Messi have become integral members of the Tasmanian Devil insurance population.

Sam and Messi, aptly named after soccer legends Sam Kerr and Lionel Messi, entered the Faulkner family's care when they were just five months old. Their mother faced challenges in caring for her four joeys, and by taking Sam and Messi under their wing, the Faulkner's ensured the safety of these precious animals while enabling their mother to focus on the two remaining joeys.

"She had four joeys. By taking Sam and Messi into care, we kept them safe, and we enabled Mum to really concentrate on the two she still has. Thankfully, she's doing really well now in our Barrington Wildlife Sanctuary."

The Faulkner household has transformed into a haven for these curious joeys. Mr Faulkner has shared his knowledge with his sons, teaching them the delicate art of bottle-feeding, engaging in play that mirrors natural activities with mother and siblings and learning the ropes of post-play cleanup. Accidents are all too common, but with teamwork, they ensure the evidence is swiftly wiped away before Mrs. Faulkner returns home.

As Sam and Messi grow and become independent, they will transition to the Australian Reptile Park before joining Aussie Ark's breeding program. For now, they are in the capable hands of the Faulkner family, receiving round-the-clock care to ensure their wellbeing and future success.

Tasmanian Devils are no longer found on mainland Australia, with their wild population in Tasmania severely affected by the deadly Devil Facial Tumour Disease. Aussie Ark proudly boasts the world's largest disease-free "insurance population," providing a lifeline to this remarkable species, safeguarding them from the brink of extinction.

RUFOUS BETTONGS EMBRACE FREEDOM!

We are excited to announce the release of 20 Rufous Bettongs into the 'wild' of the 400ha Barrington Wildlife Sanctuary. This event marks a remarkable milestone in our ongoing efforts to safeguard this enigmatic Australian species from the brink of extinction.

The Rufous Bettong, often described as a 'living fossil', is a cherished gem of the animal kingdom, boasting a unique blend of kangaroo-like traits combined with an intriguing growl reminiscent of a bear. This elusive animal, with their nocturnal habits, remains relatively unknown to many Australians. Despite their obscurity, they face a critical threat of extinction due to the relentless impact of feral predators.

For six years, Aussie Ark has been diligently breeding this extraordinary species within our Species Recovery Unit in the Barrington Tops facility. The release stands as a testament to the success of our conservation program, constituting only the second 'wild' release conducted by Aussie Ark.

The Barrington Wildlife Sanctuary, our Rufous Bettongs' new home, offers a sanctuary

reminiscent of a utopia, shielding them from habitat loss and predatory threats in a pristine environment that echoes the charm of pre-colonial times.

Joining us in this momentous event, Managing Director Tim Faulkner expressed his delight in witnessing the release and its positive implications for the species.

HISTORIC PARMA WALLABY TRANSFER!

Aussie Ark, in collaboration with the Australian Reptile Park, has successfully transferred two Parma wallabies from the Central Coast to the Barrington Tops. These remarkable wallabies, born at the Australian Reptile Park, are now destined to join Aussie Ark's world-leading Parma wallaby breeding and rewilding program.

What's even more exciting is the discovery of a precious joey nestled in the female's pouch found during her health check before the transfer. This surprise serves as a reminder of the critical importance of our collective conservation efforts. The health check and transfer were conducted by Aussie Ark's Operations Manager Dean Reid and Australian Reptile Park's Mammal & Bird Keeper Lauren Hunter.

"First step was a rigorous health check," Mr Reid said. "This involved a microchip check, weighing them, inspecting feet and teeth, and checking the fat of their tails to give them a 'body condition' score. Both wallabies had a score of three, which is perfect!"

"It was amazing seeing the joey! It was tiny; no fur, ears still closed down on the head, blind, and fused to the teat...so probably just a couple of months old."

The Parma wallaby, a tiny macropod once thought to be extinct, faces threats from feral predation and land clearing. By fostering their growth and preserving their natural habitat, we are taking a significant step towards preventing the extinction of this species.

Under the expert supervision of Aussie Ark's Operations Manager Dean Reid and Australian Reptile Park's Mammal & Bird Keeper Lauren Hunter, the wallabies, along with their young joey, were safely transported to the Barrington Wildlife Sanctuary. Here, they will acclimatise to the Alpine environment before their eventual release into the sanctuary later this year, where they will thrive in the freedom of their natural habitat.

Aussie Ark is proud to be a world leader in breeding and rewilding threatened and endangered species, and the Long-nosed Potoroo is one of our signature species. Each of the 20 Potoroos released were born and bred at the Ark. Unfortunately, potoroos have faced immense challenges in the wild, from feral predators to land clearing and bushfires.

These little marsupials play a vital role as "ecosystem terrestrial engineers" in the Australian bush. Their foraging helps oxygenate and moisturise the soil, aids in decomposition, and reduces fuel load, thus reducing the incidence and severity of fires. With the El Niño cycle on the horizon, the work of potoroos in our forests becomes even more critical in safeguarding our environment from droughts and wildfires.

At Aussie Ark, we proudly house one of the world's most important "insurance population" of Long-nosed Potoroos within our 400-hectare feral-proof Sanctuary. This sanctuary is not only a refuge, but a beacon of hope for this species' future.


